Into the Word:

From Bible footnotes or previous studies, what do we know about the authority of the "captain of the temple guard" and the Sadducees?

How does the situation we read about in Acts 4:1-12 compare with Jesus' healing of the blind man in John 9:20-22?

Being "put out of the synagogue", excommunicated or persecuted are concepts somewhat foreign to many. What might be some of the thoughts or concerns of those in this situation?

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What must it have been like for this man born lame, who had spent his life literally on the outside, to be in the temple standing with Peter and John as they were confronted by the religious leaders?

How empowering must it have been for this man to not only feel his new found strength but to hear Peter's words in verses 11&12?

Into Life:

How did this concept of the "Supremacy of Christ" translate in the lives of Peter, John and the other disciples?

In light of Lane's comment, "**we live in a culture where it seems the only thing that people are certain of- is that nothing is certain,**" how do you think the person who isn't here on Sunday morning would respond to the concept of "The Supremacy of Christ"?

What should this concept mean for believers today?

What would be different about us if we came to grips with this concept?

How do we get those who aren't here to understand and embrace the Supremacy of Christ?
